Hello McKay Families! This week many classes recognized Earth Day with art, writing, and activities about how we take care of our amazing planet. Student Learning Survey

The BC Ministry of Education and Childcare Annual Student Survey is an important way for schools and school districts to learn information that helps them make decisions and plan for student support.
