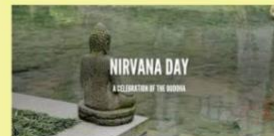

Valentine's Day, celebrated on February 14, is a global holiday dedicated to love and affection. Originating from ancient Roman and Christian traditions, it has evolved into a day for expressing love through gifts, flowers, chocolates, and heartfelt messages. While commonly associated with romantic relationships, many also celebrate friendships and familial bonds. Traditions vary worldwide, with some cultures focusing on gift exchanges, while others emphasize gestures of appreciation. Despite its commercialization, Valentine's Day remains a meaningful occasion for people to express love and connection in personal and cultural ways.



Women's Memorial March

Honouring MMIWG2S+ and survivors



The 35th Annual Women's Memorial March is to honor missing and murdered Indigenous women, girls, and 2S/gender-diverse people (MMIWG2S+). This annual, volunteer-driven event, features a march, ceremony, and community feast, advocating for justice against systemic violence.



NIRVANA DAY

Nirvana Day, also known as Parinirvana Day, is a Buddhist observance held on February 8 or 15 (depending on tradition) to commemorate the Buddha's passing into final Nirvana after his death. It is a day for reflection on impermanence, enlightenment, and the cycle of birth and rebirth. The day is widely observed in countries with strong Buddhist traditions, including Japan, China, Vietnam, Thailand, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, and Tibet, as well as by Buddhist communities in the UK, the US, Canada, and Australia. Observances often include meditation, chanting, temple visits, and readings from the Parinirvana Sutra, which describes the Buddha's final moments. Many also engage in acts of kindness and charity, honoring the Buddha's teachings on compassion and detachment from suffering.

Inclement Weather: School Closure Notifications

The district will try to determine school closures due to inclement weather by 6:30 a.m.
Updates will be delivered using social media and school and district websites.

No radio or television announcement will be made saying that schools are open. Only school closures will be announced by the media. To reach as many people as possible - as quickly as possible - we work closely with our local media to share information. Listen to local radio stations and follow local news outlets online to also get information about the impact of severe weather or emergencies in our schools.

If snowfall begins while school is in session, in most circumstances, schools will remain OPEN until the end of the school day.

If schools are open, and you wish to keep your child home due to weather conditions, you may do so. Please let your school know of this decision. Parents/guardians are responsible for their child's safe travel to school.

Stay Informed with SchoolMessenger Text Alerts (Opt-In)

Our District uses SchoolMessenger to share important school and district updates, including weather closures, emergency notifications, reminders, and time-sensitive announcements.

All families with a current cell phone number in our MyEdBC database will receive a text message from SchoolMessenger (Text #: 978338) in February 2026. To start receiving text alerts, you will need to opt in.

How to opt in:

1. Watch for a text from SchoolMessenger (Text #: 978338).
2. Reply with "Y" to 978338.
3. You will receive a confirmation message letting you know you're successfully subscribed.

Want alerts on more than one device?

To receive text alerts on multiple phones, each phone number must opt in separately by replying "Y" to 978338.

Dear Parents and Families:

The Scholastic Book Fair is coming back to McKay Elementary!

We are excited to announce that we will be having a Scholastic Book Fair taking place on **Monday, February 9th to Thursday, February 12th, 2026 (Hours are on the reverse side)**. Students will be able to view the Book Fair with their classes during their weekly library period. This wonderful literacy event is always popular amongst students, parents, and teachers and encourages a love of reading.

Each purchase helps raise funds to build and improve our library collection, and there are two methods to participate:

1. Your child can purchase in person during their regularly weekly library visit (Divisions 8 to 13) or during school hours at recess or lunch breaks (Divisions 1 to 7, see scheduled days), and students with their parents can purchase afterschool and at conference times. We accept cash and card.
2. Grades K-5 can purchase a title/titles from the paper flyer using the "Books I Want to Read" Form and provide the exact cash payment. Please include your child's name and division # on the form. These forms and cash payments should be returned to the school librarian by Thursday, February 12th, 2026. The books are scheduled to be delivered to your child on Tuesday, February 17th, 2026.

LUCKY DRAW CONTEST: To encourage reading and for supporting this literacy fundraising, students who purchase books in person or using the flyer order form **by Wednesday, February 11th** will be entered into an early bird lucky draw to win free Book Fair money (6 winners, prizes range from a \$5 Book Fair voucher to a \$20 Book Fair voucher). The winners will be announced on **Thursday, February 12th during the morning announcements**.

We look forward to seeing you and your families during our Scholastic Book Fair and thank you, in advance, for supporting this great literacy fundraiser! Mostly, thank you for believing in books and the importance reading has on your child's future.
