Telus – Internet for Good Program

Families that receive the maximum Child Care Benefit and can provide a recent Canada Child Benefit statement showing your family net income of less than or equal to \$34,863 can apply for discounted internet services.

Internet Options:

- The program offers three choices of internet packages that range from \$10 to \$30 per month (not inc. taxes).
- Each plan gives a range of internet services related to upload/download speeds and data usage.
- Plans are guaranteed for 2 years at which time clients are required to re-apply.


Step 1: Go to Program Page

Step 2: Apply On-Line

- You can apply on-line for this program. Applicants will be required to provide some documentation and details at the time of the application.

Step 3: Telus Follow Up

- Successful applicants will receive a one-time code and a call centre number from Telus to activate the service and arrange a service appointment.
