




Guru Nanak Dev Sahib, the founder of Sikhism, was born on April 15, 1469, in Nankana Sahib, Punjab (now in Pakistan). His birth is celebrated as Guru Nanak Jayanti or Gurpurab, a significant festival for Sikhs worldwide. Guru Nanak's teachings emphasized equality, compassion, and devotion to one God. His life and message continue to inspire millions, promoting values of peace and harmony. Celebrations typically include prayers, community gatherings, and processions at gurdwaras, highlighting his legacy and the principles of Sikhism.



The International Day of Tolerance is observed on November 16 each year. Established by the United Nations in 1996, this day promotes respect, appreciation, and recognition of cultural diversity and human rights. It encourages individuals and communities to foster understanding and dialogue among different cultures and beliefs. The day serves as a reminder of the importance of tolerance in creating peaceful societies and aims to combat discrimination, violence, and prejudice. 

Richmond School District 38 is excited to welcome Kindergarten registration applications for children born in 2020, turning 5 in 2025. These children will begin Kindergarten in September 2025.

Online registration opens on November 1, 2024.

We encourage families to complete their registration within the Priority 1 registration window, which spans from November 1, 2024 to January 17, 2024, to maximize their chances of securing a spot at their catchment school.

All registration applications received any time during the Priority 1 registration period will receive placement decisions by February 7, 2025.

Videos detailing Kindergarten registration have been made available on our District website, providing new parents with guidance on the registration process, English Language Learner (ELL) assessments, and District Program Options (Early French Immersion and Montessori).
