Quviasukvik is a traditional celebration in Inuit culture, marking the midwinter festival. It is a time of feasting, socializing, and giving thanks, often involving games, music, and rituals to honor the community and the renewal of the sun. It is a joyful occasion, symbolizing hope and the return of light after the long winter.



Hanukkah is a Jewish holiday that lasts for eight days and nights, usually in December. It celebrates the rededication of the Second Temple in Jerusalem and the miracle of the oil that burned for eight days despite only having enough for one. Traditions include lighting the menorah, playing dreidel, eating special foods, and giving gifts.



January 1, honoring African culture and heritage. It was created in 1966 by Dr. Maulana Karenga and is based on seven principles known as the "Nguzo Saba." These principles focus on values like unity, self-determination, collective work, and faith. Each day of Kwanzaa emphasizes one of these principles, and families celebrate with rituals, including lighting candles on a special candle holder called a kinara, sharing meals, and exchanging gifts. Kwanzaa is a time for reflection, community building, and cultural pride.



Christmas is a Christian holiday celebrated on December 25th, marking the birth of Jesus Christ. It is a time for family gatherings, gift-giving, festive meals, and decorations. Many people also observe the holiday with traditions like singing carols, attending church services, and spreading goodwill.

#### THE MIDDLE YEARS DEVELOPMENT INSTRUMENT (MDI) IS COMING TO YOUR SCHOOL IN JANUARY/MID-MARCH!

The Richmond School District has partnered with the Human Early Learning Partnership (HELP) at the University of British Columbia to measure and promote children's social and emotional development, health, well-being, and assets through the Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI). The Middle Years Development Instrument (MDI) is a self-report questionnaire that asks children in middle childhood about their thoughts, feelings and experiences. The MDI is the first survey of its kind to gather information about the lives of children both in school, in the home and in the community, from their own perspective. The survey questions align with the BC Ministry of Education's K-12 curriculum, which includes a focus on promoting children's personal and social competencies.


Grade 5 and 8 students are invited to complete the MDI during class time between: January 14<sup>th</sup> and March 14<sup>th</sup>, 2025.
