





Significant Dates in our Community
















International Holocaust Remembrance Day is observed annually on January 27th to honor the memory of the six million Jewish victims of the Holocaust, as well as millions of others persecuted by the Nazi regime during World War II. The date marks the anniversary of the liberation of the Auschwitz-Birkenau concentration camp in 1945. Established by the United Nations in 2005, this day serves to promote education, commemorate the victims, and reaffirm the commitment to prevent future acts of genocide. It is a time for reflection on the atrocities of the past and a call to action against hatred, discrimination, and antisemitism.



The National Day of Remembrance of the Quebec City Mosque
Attack and Action Against Islamophobia, observed annually on
January 29th, commemorates the tragic 2017 attack on the
Islamic Cultural Centre of Quebec City, where six men lost their
lives and many others were injured while at prayer. Established
by the Canadian government in 2021, the day honors the victims,
supports survivors, and acknowledges the lasting impact on their
families and communities. It also serves as a call to action to
combat Islamophobia, promote inclusion, and uphold the values
of diversity and mutual respect in Canada.



Lunar New Year 2025, celebrated on Wednesday, January 29th, marks the transition into the Year of the Snake in the lunar calendar. It is a major holiday for many Asian cultures, including Chinese, Korean, Vietnamese, Mongolian, Tibetan, and others, each with unique customs and traditions. The festival symbolizes renewal, family unity, and the welcoming of prosperity and good fortune.

Common practices include family reunions, honoring ancestors, festive meals and the preparation of special dishes, exchanging symbolic gifts like red envelopes or tokens of luck, and engaging in cultural performances such as dragon or lion dances. Across Asia and beyond, Lunar New Year promotes themes of hope, renewal, and harmony.

National Day of Remembrance and Action Against Islamophobia

The Day of Remembrance and Action on Islamophobia in British Columbia, observed annually on January 29th, highlights the importance of addressing Islamophobia. This day reaffirms the province's commitment to fostering inclusivity, diversity, and respect for all communities while acknowledging the harmful impacts of anti-Muslim hatred. It serves as a call to action to combat discrimination and build a safer, more equitable society for everyone.






Students will go outside for recess and lunchtime play in all weather. Rain gear, layers, and extra clothing are helpful to stay comfortable!




