February is Black History Month

Lantern Festival: Feb. 12 Magha Puja Day: Feb. 12 Valentine's Day: Feb. 14





The Lantern Festival is a vibrant celebration observed across various Asian cultures, marking the first full moon of the lunar new year.

Celebrated in China, Taiwan, Hong Kong, Vietnam (as Tét Nguyên Tiêu), South Korea (as Jeongwol Daeboreum), and parts of Southeast Asia, the festival symbolizes light, renewal, and hope. People illuminate the night with lanterns—floating them in the sky, on water, or carrying them in processions—while engaging in traditions like solving lantern riddles, eating symbolic foods such as tangyuan (glutinous rice balls) or red bean rice, and enjoying cultural performances like dragon and lion dances. The festival fosters unity, prosperity, and spiritual well-being across diverse communities.



Magha Puja, also known as Sangha Day, is an important Buddhist festival celebrated on the full moon day of the third lunar month (usually in February or March). It commemorates a significant gathering of 1,250 enlightened monks who assembled spontaneously to hear the Buddha deliver the Ovada Patimokkha, a fundamental teaching emphasizing morality, meditation, and wisdom. The day is marked by merit-making activities, chanting, meditation, and candlelight processions, symbolizing devotion and unity within the Buddhist community. It is especially significant in Thailand, Cambodia, Laos, and Myanmar.



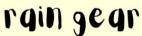



Need dental insurance?

If your children don't have dental insurance, they may be eligible for dental benefits.





Canadian Dental Care Plan

Eligibility:

- Do not have access to dental insurance
- Have an adjusted family net income of less than \$90,000
- Be a Canadian resident for tax purposes
- ✓ Have filed your tax return in the previous year
- Children must be under 18 years old

If your child has dental insurance through a provincial, territorial or federal government social program, **they can still qualify** for the Canadian Dental Care Plan

BC Healthy Kids Program

Eligibility:

- Must be eligible for Medical Services Plan (MSP) Supplementary Benefits
- Have an adjusted family net income of \$42,000or less
- Children must be under 19 years old

Who is Eligible?

Children are eligible for coverage if they are:

- a) more than 6 months old;
- b) less than 27 years old; and
- c) live in Canada, except the province of Quebec.

If a child is 14 years old or older at any time during the Coverage Period, they must be a full-time student within the 12 months prior to any claim. We defin a full-time student as being enrolled in a minimum of 3 courses at the same time, during any 4-month period.

If you have children enrolled in differnt school s σ school boards, they may all be insured under one policy.
