Inclement Weather: School Closure Notifications

The district will try to determine school closures due to inclement weather by 6:30 a.m. Updates will be delivered using social media and school and district websites.

No radio or television announcement will be made saying that schools are open. Only school closures will be announced by the media. To reach as many people as possible - as quickly as possible - we work closely with our local media to share information. Listen to local radio stations and follow local news outlets online to also get information about the impact of severe weather or emergencies in our schools.

If snowfall begins while school is in session, in most circumstances, schools will remain OPEN until the end of the school day.

If schools are open, and you wish to keep your child home due to weather conditions, you may do so. Please let your school know of this decision. Parents/guardians are responsible for their child's safe travel to school.

Stay Informed with SchoolMessenger Text Alerts (Opt-In)

Our District uses SchoolMessenger to share important school and district updates, including weather closures, emergency notifications, reminders, and time-sensitive announcements.

All families with a current cell phone number in our MyEdBC database will receive a text message from SchoolMessenger (Text #: 978338) in February 2026. To start receiving text alerts, you will need to opt in.

How to opt in:

1. Watch for a text from SchoolMessenger (Text #: 978338).
2. Reply with "Y" to 978338.
3. You will receive a confirmation message letting you know you're successfully subscribed.

Want alerts on more than one device?

To receive text alerts on multiple phones, each phone number must opt in separately by replying "Y" to 978338.

Parent's Guide to Discord

Discord age requirements are **17+ for the iOS app, 13+ for the Android app, and 13+ for the website**. There are over 260 million monthly users, with 70% of users between the ages of 18-34.

What Is Discord?

Discord is a free communication platform that allows users to chat via text, voice, and video. It started as a gaming chat space but is now widely used for various social communities. Conversations happen in "servers" (groups) that can have multiple "channels" for different topics. Users can communicate via the messaging platform (text, images, video, etc...) or via voice / video chats. Discord requires users to submit their birthday but age verification is minimal. Those who are under 18 will be prevented from some channels that contain age-restricted content.



Why Kids Love Discord



Customization and Control

Kids can create their own servers, set roles, and personalize the experience, which appeals to their desire for independence.



Private and Authentic

Discord isn't about public profiles or likes, and there are no algorithms pushing content or advertising.



Variety

Discord offers servers focused on any topic where kids can connect with like-minded others.

Potential Risks

Inappropriate Content

Both public and private servers can include adult language, sexual content, or violent imagery.

Mental Health Impact

Constant notifications and pressure to stay online can lead to stress or sleep disruption.



Cyberbullying & Harassment

Group chats and voice channels can lead to bullying, exclusion, or toxic behaviour.



Stranger Interaction

Teens can receive friend requests or direct messages from unknown users unless privacy settings are adjusted.



Safety Tips for Parents

1. Learn the Basics

- Familiarize yourself with Discord's features—servers, channels, roles, and permissions.
- Discuss why your child wants to use Discord and agree on rules for usage.
- Check Age Compliance: Ensure your child meets the minimum age requirement.



2. Review 'Content & Social' Settings

- Block Mature Sexual Media and Graphic Media
- Filter all DMs for spam
- Allow 'Direct Messages' from server members"
- Turn off Message requests from server members you may not know
- Limit friend requests to "Friends of Friends."

3. Family Center

- Connect your child's account with Guardian in the Family Center settings. This allows parents / guardians to:
 - See new friends added
 - Servers joined or participated in
 - Total time spent in calls across direct message, group chats and servers



4. Teach Online Safety

- Remind kids: Never, never share personal info, passwords, or click unknown links.
- Report inappropriate behaviour using Discord's Report Message feature.
- Be extra cautious when interacting with other users you don't know.
